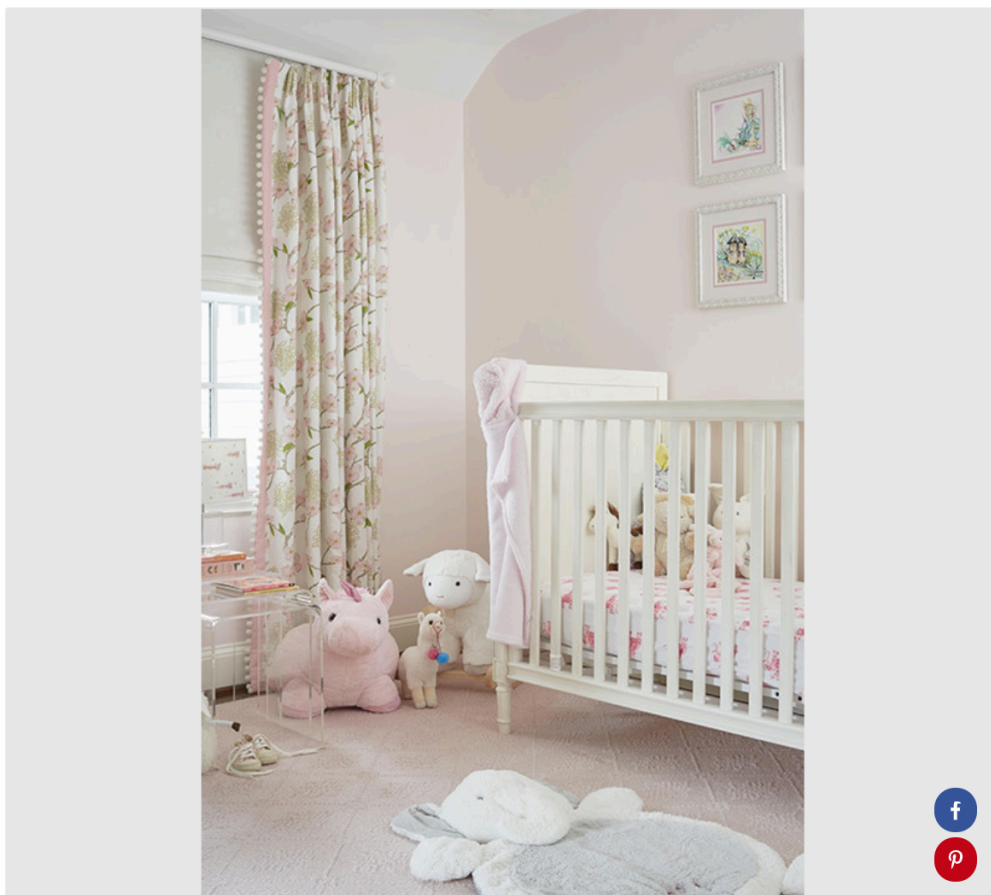

Echoing other designers' viewpoints, [Kelley Proxmire](#) notes, "I try not to make the nursery design too juvenile. Consider serene, soft, and light elements. Keep the design approach more classic." She applied this strategy to a recent project. "We installed both roman shades and drapery panels in order to have complete blackout in the room," the designer shares. "The fabric used on the windows is not too juvenile, so that these can be appropriate for any age."
